## Space Explorer - Extension Activities

These "Extension Activities" are not covered in our video training and may require additional items from home.

How Craters Are Formed - Pour sand into a deep tray (like the one from our Mad Scientist Toolbox). Find a large rock and drop it roughly onto the sand. Explain to your child that this is how craters are formed-large rocks fall to the ground and the force creates a crater.

Constellations With Toothpicks And Marshmallows - Using the constellation cards as a guide, recreate the constellations by using marshmallows and toothpicks. Then, when you are finished, you can eat the marshmallows. Yum!

Make Constellations With Fabric And Needle - Just like with the lacing activity, you can recreate the constellations on fabric. Draw the dots for the constellation of your choice on the fabric. Then, use thread and a needle to connect the dots on the constellations.

**Paint Wood Shapes -** In Montessori classrooms, the geometric solids are all painted blue. This might be a fun project for you and your child to do together.
